Below left: According to Mike Swims Under, the tipi at left was an Otter-painted lodge belonging to Charley Reevis. It was being used here as the fasting lodge for the Sun Dance Woman of an Okan held at Heart Butte in 1942. Further back at right is the Mountain Lion-painted lodge of Dick White Man. The design was said to have originally come from the Siksika.
