A Round Dance is in progress inside the tribal Sun Dance encampment, c.1915. Several of the younger women are wearing modern shoes and dresses, thus bringing another change into the Pikunni world of dancing. The Round Dance itself is thought to have come from neighboring tribes, sometime back in the buffalo days.
